The Internet's primary purpose is to create a decentralized network that gives users significant control over their data, as initially envisioned by Tim Berners-Lee. However, we must also address the negative aspects of the web, such as hate speech and bullying, to ensure it remains a positive force. Severe violations of internet principles include collecting data about children, engaging in bullying or trolling, recording VoIP calls without consent, sharing personal information like passwords, addresses, or photos without permission, and accessing other people's internet networks without authorization. These actions undermine the core values of the Internet. While a decentralized network offers some level of anonymity and data control, using the Internet as a tool for psychological harm—through bullying or trolling—is a fundamental breach of its intended purpose.
